\$1 a week Total Gift = \$52

Equivalent to: One candy bar; Five lives on Candy Crush

Provides: 12 elementary school students with trained volunteer tutors to help with reading and math

\$2 a week Total Gift = \$104

Equivalent to: Two lottery tickets, One large iced tea

Provides: Two potential donors to be typed for the Bone Marrow Registry

\$3 a week Total Gift = \$156

Equivalent to: Two packs of gum; Six pack of soda

Provides: Six months of counseling sessions for a family dealing with Alzheimer's

\$4 a week Total Gift = \$208

Equivalent to: One burger, fries and shake; A ballpoint pen

What is the CFC?

The Combined Federal Campaign (CFC) is the annual fundraising drive conducted by federal employees in their workplace each fall. Each year, federal employees and raise millions of dollars through the CFC that benefit thousands of charities.

The CFC was created by President Kennedy in 1961 as an annual workplace charitable giving campaign for all federal civilian, military and postal employees.



What Areas Do We Cover?

For the first time this year, the whole of Louisiana will be covered by one CFC—the CFC of Louisiana! We are very excited to be running a state wide campaign this year.

Why Give Through the CFC?

There are several great reasons for giving through the CFC:

1. Payroll deduction, only available through the CFC, is a painless way to give—you won't miss money you never see. Most of us can give a substantial annual gift on a bi-weekly or monthly basis.
2. Your gift through CFC has a greater impact because it is combined with contributions from other federal employees.
3. Charities that receive donations through CFC also receive a portion of undesignated donations
4. Charities prefer to process a single check from CFC rather than numerous checks from individual contributors.

Who are the CFC Charities?

All charities listed in this year's CFC Charity Listing applied to the campaign, either nationally at the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) or to the CFC of Louisiana's Principal Combined Fund Organization (PCFO) managing the CFC. The CFC of Louisiana's Local Federal Coordinating Committee organized a team of federal employees to review the applications.

CFC Charities serve in many areas, including but not limited to:

- Education
- Health
- Animal Welfare
- Environmental Issues
- Returned Combat Veterans
- Housing
- Youth Development

If your favorite agency is not listed in the CFC Charity Listing, it may not have applied or was turned down due to lack of compliance. Donors cannot designate to an agency not in the CFC Charity Listing or in OPM's Universal Giving Listing (check opm.gov/cfc for the updated list). New applicants are warmly welcomed each spring during the application process. Many local and

national CFC agencies participate in the CFC because they were referred by federal employees who support them.
